






PLAR in Universities: State of the Field

- Little headway in having PLAR widely accepted in universities in Canada (Kennedy, 2003)
- Same situation in other parts of the world
 - UK
 - Australia
 - South Africa



What do we know about why PLAR not accepted?

- Reports talk about concern re: quality control, time, money
- Mostly based on opinions of administrators
- Little information from professors themselves



Professors as Learners?

- Haven't yet learned about PLAR?
- Slow learners? Resistant learners?
- What would an adult educator do?
- Try to understand the learners' perspective!



Who is the average Canadian University Professor?


- Average age was 49 in 2000 (AUCC, 2000)
- Started careers in 1970s
- Many now thinking about retirement, rather than innovations like PLAR
- Most have only experiential learning about teaching
 - Society for Teaching and Learning in Higher Education started in 1981; constitution adopted in 1998
 - UBC's teaching centre started in 1987
 - Queen's in 1992
 - Carleton U teaching centre in 2002



The life of a university professor?

- Many have little work experience outside of the university
- "What was your career path to your present position?
 - I got a Ph.D. in my field and went directly to a job at a university."




The life of a university professor?

- "For most faculty members...discussions about teaching and learning tend to be fugitive affairs." (Huber, 2002. p. 25)




Learning & Assessment of Learning

- Profs are subject matter experts, not learning and assessment experts
- PLAR premises not meaningful if don't understand learning and assessment




Cause for optimism?

- 11,000 new faculty in next few years (about 1/3 of full-time professors) (Queen's Alumni Review, Fall, 2005)
- University teaching centres' courses for grad students, new faculty
- Recruitment ads feature requests for "teaching portfolio"
- Opportunity to inform new professoriate?
